Facility shortcomings are based on violations of the regulations and F-Tags are used to identify performance deficiencies. The purpose of the surveys is to protect residents and ensure they are getting quality care.

F-605 Free From Chemical Restraints

The intent of this requirement is for each person to attain and maintain their highest practicable well-being in an environment that prohibits the use of chemical restraints:

- · For discipline or convenience
- · If not required to treat a resident's medical symptoms

When a medication is indicated to treat a medical symptom, the facility must:

- Use the least restrictive alternative for the least amount of time
- · Provide ongoing re-evaluation of the need for the medication
- · Not use the medication for discipline or convenience

F-756 Drug Regimen Review F-757 Drug Regimen is Free From Unnecessary Drugs

The pharmacist must report any irregularities to the attending physician and the facility's medical director and director of nursing. Additionally, these reports must be acted upon. Each resident's drug regimen must be free from unnecessary drugs. An unnecessary drug is any drug when used in excessive dose, for excessive duration, without adequate monitoring, and/or without adequate indication for its use.

F-758 Free From Unnecessary Psychotropic Medications

Facility must ensure that psychotropic drugs are not given unless necessary to treat a condition documented in the clinical record. Unless clinically contraindicated, patients receiving them must have gradual dose reductions and behavioral interventions, and these must be documented in the record. Psychotropic medications should not be ordered as PRN for longer than 14 days without appropriate documentation in the record with rationale for continued use.

F-759 Free From Medication Error Rate of 5% or More F-760 Free of Significant Medication Errors

The relative significance of medication errors is a matter of professional judgment. Following three general guidelines helps determine whether a medication error is significant or not: resident condition, drug category, and frequency of error.
