



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

# The State of Practice Groups Today

Fragmented workflows — driven largely by inefficient and poorly integrated EHR systems — remain a major barrier to delivering high-quality care. A <u>recent review</u> found that poorly designed EHR interfaces frequently disrupt clinical workflows by causing task switching, excessive screen navigation, and fragmented information display. These usability issues often necessitate workarounds—such as duplicating documentation or using external tools—leading to increased documentation time and cognitive burden for practitioners.

Fragmented workflows make it difficult to access the most accurate, up-to-date information at the point of care. For example, requiring staff to log into multiple systems, such as the facility electronic health record (EHR), their own, and the health information exchange (HIE) to review clinical information hinders timely decision making. It also makes it challenging for all staff members to stay on the same page, ultimately exacerbating coordination breakdowns, not only across the care continuum, but also within individual practice groups and specialists.

This disruption is not only operationally costly but also strongly linked to rising levels of stress and burnout among these practitioners, who consistently identify system fragmentation as a core driver of their challenges. Additionally, the lack of integrated, efficient workflows not only impacts staff satisfaction but also patient safety and outcomes.

These challenges urgently demand that practice groups think beyond standard approaches to accessing and sharing clinical data. Practice groups that innovate and integrate their workflows will emerge as leaders in patient care as well as attract and retain more practitioners.

## Better Decisions at the Point of Care


The right EHR offers both improved clinical insights and key operational workflows. The clinical acumen of a platform designed for practice groups offers smart EHR tools that empower practitioners to:

- Streamline and accelerate documentation with voice-to-text and Al-powered templates
- Access more robust data analytics from a wider and deeper set of data
- · Leverage clinical decision support for proactive interventions
- Track where patients are in real time via HIE connection

For example, real-time alerts triggered at patient registration can flag high-risk patients, summarize recent hospitalizations, and highlight medication changes. These features have been shown to <u>decrease avoidable hospitalizations by up to 15%</u> and support more timely interventions.






#### **Enhancing Chronic Care Management:**




## Financial and Operational Impact

Interoperability initiatives, such as the <u>TEFCA framework</u>, are driving seamless data exchange across care settings




Mobile-optimized, practitionercentric tools are enabling care delivery anywhere, anytime




